














### Meet the fall animals our kindergarteners made during STEM this week!



We are studying "Pointillism" in our Art classes. 3rd Grade Art Class worked on making a "Fall Scene" from a different prospective. We went outside looked up at trees. Learned how to draw branches and used pointillism painting technique. 1st grade and 5K classes made their personal handprint fall tree. We traced their hands and arms for the trunk of tree. Then used "pointillism" technique to make fall color tree. Each one is unique just like the fall trees outside!
